Google...Wikipedia...? MEH!

- ▶ Enter more than one word:

“genetics” will get you very different results than “genetic engineering using sheep” (106 billion vs. 515 thousand)

- ▶ Advanced search:

limit years of publication, languages, types of publications... (see the cog on the right side of the page)

- ▶ Evaluate each page using CRAAP guidelines



Use our databases (EBSCO + Gale)

- ▶ keywords vs. subjects vs.
- ▶ phrases vs. questions
- ▶ -use the limiters available (date of publication, type, language, etc.)
- ▶ -information is already vetted! (should pass CRAAP)

- ▶ Creative Commons:

 - ▶ This way you have permission to use photos
 - ▶ Still required to site the creator and original web source if available
